From the Editor

The Bulletin of the Astronomical Society of India (BASI) has been the first Indian journal to cross an impact factor (IF) of 2 as listed by Thomson Reuters Journal Citation Reports (JCR) with an IF of 2.600 for 2010 (Jain 2011). During 2011, it continued to lead all Indian journals with a slightly improved IF of 2.722 as listed in JCR-2011, with the ones with an IF greater than 1.0 being almost entirely from either the medical or biological sciences (Gunasekaran & Arunachalam 2012). Although this is good news for the Society, this has been dependent on a limited number of well-cited papers, and BASI could do with much more active support from within our community itself.

During 2012, 31 review and research papers by 90 authors were published in the Bulletin of the Astronomical Society of India, with approximately a half of the authors being from India, which is an improvement, and the other half being largely from North America and Europe. This year includes the special 2012 September issue on novae, co-edited by G.C. Anupama, where many leading workers in the field contributed, and two reviews by the Professor M. K. Vainu Bappu gold medal awardees, Niayesh Afshordi and Nissim Kanekar, based on their medal acceptance lectures.
